### **RED Express - Methodology**



- 1,000 interviews conducted by phone using a random digit dial sample to ensure all households, including ex-directory, are covered.
- Quotas set and final data weighted to ensure that the sample is randomly representative of the total Irish population aged 18+.
- Fieldwork conducted as follows:

Q.1 25<sup>th</sup>-27<sup>th</sup> February 2008.

Q.2 10<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> March 2008.




## Catholic schools shows preference overall, with almost half choosing this option. Only 1 in 10 would choose a school where no religion is taught.


